Injection
Teach opening 100 pages from at Taftazani's 550 page commentary in Balagha

Desirable Effect
Student is trained to think at the level of the scholars

Start Ibn Aqeel's commentary on the Alfiyya

Desirable Effect
Interest level of student reaches new high

Injection
Introduce the two texts from Al-Ghazali in classical logic

Desirable Effect
Student is exposed to the most wonderful aspects of Quranic eloquence

Desirable Effect
Student develops deciphering capabilities and can now read without vowels with concious effort

Injection
Begin tafsir of Quran component with emphasis on highlighting the Balagha of the verses through advanced books such as Al Aloosi and Abu as-Saood

Injection
Begin first classical text in Nahw without vowels

All vocabulary remains relevant to the needs of the student

With every new word learnt student is actually learning entire families of words

Student does not get overwhelmed by too many rules that seem random

With every new major discussion in grammar the student experiences A Ha moments

Injection
Place extra emphasis on Sarf in the initial months

Desirable Effect
Vocabulary builds organically and effortlessly

Desirable Effect
Gaps in understanding are quickly filled and core theory is solidified

Injection
Teach the next most broadly applicable aspects of the language based on the structures occurring in the book

Desirable Effect
Enthusiasm level of the student goes through the roof

Desirable Effect
Teaching method fully respects the needs of the student

Injection
Get students reading an actual Arabic book by the third week of class

Desirable Effect
Core theory taught at the beginning comes to life

Desirable Effect
Strong emotional connection to the studies is created

Isolate from the language a core and central theme focusing on "non-word meanings" and teach that first

Injection
Lead with explaining how the majority of meanings in Arabic do not come from words, but instead from vowels and patterns

Student is exposed to the aspects that truly make Arabic the most superior language on the planet
